

# Clayton Wayne Wickham, M.D.

August 14, 1932– July 24, 2019

Captain Clayton W. Wickham, age 79 passed away July 24, 2019 in Escondido, California. He resided with his wife Barbara, A. Epp Wickham. He was born August 14, 1939 in Eau Claire, Wisconsin to Meryle A. and Helen Barney Wickham. He graduated from Regis Catholic High School in Eau Claire. He received a degree in Medical Technology before going on to attend and graduate from the University of Wisconsin-Madison with a degree as a Medical Doctor.

He spent his medical internship in King County Hospital, Seattle, Washington, where he joined the U.S. Navy in 1969. His duty station was at Cecil Field, Jacksonville, Florida. While there he earned his wings as a flight surgeon at NAMI Pensacola, Florida (1972-1973).

Spending six years at sea, he served as a flight surgeon aboard the carriers *USS Enterprise*, *USS Ranger*, and the *USS Kitty Hawk*. He served at Sigonella, Sicily (Italy) and, Gaeta, Italy with the 6th fleet. His last overseas tour was as a senior medical officer at III MEF, 3rd MarDiv, Okinawa, Japan (1988-1992). Returning to the states in 1992 he served out his career as a senior medical officer at BMC NAS Miramar and was honorably discharged in 1996.

His awards include: the Navy Commendation medal, Meritorious Unit Commendation, Navy Expeditionary medal, sea service deployment ribbon (3), National Defense Service medal (2), Navy & Marine Corps overseas service ribbon, marksman rifleman ribbon, pistol shot sharpshooter ribbon and the Meritorious Service Medal.

He was preceded in death by both parents; brothers Alan and Patrick, sisters Anne and Margaret Wickham. He is survived by his wife Barbara, daughter Valerie and her husband Sean Hire and their daughter Finnley. He is also survived by a sister Barbara (Michael) Coyle in South Dakota and a brother, Gerald and his wife Sharon in Wisconsin, as well as nieces and nephews scattered across the U.S.

### **A reminder from The American Legion, J.B. Clark Post 149, Escondido, CA**

When we were kids our school day began by reciting The Pledge of Allegiance. That was before "under God" was added in 1954 by President Dwight Eisenhower.
